Course purpose and objectives	<p>The main objectives of the course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The course constitutes a continuation of the course “LAW OF TORTS I,” which examined the fundamental principles and concepts of Torts Law, with particular emphasis on the tort of negligence. • The aim of the course is to examine a broad category of torts, both against individuals and against their property and economic interests. • Study and analysis of the elements, legal consequences, and defenses of specific torts with reference to relevant case law. • Analysis of cases of Vicarious Liability. 			
Learning outcomes	<p>Upon completion of the course students are expected to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Analyze the constituent elements - including specific defenses for each - of torts such as Assault, False Imprisonment, Illegal possession of goods, Defamation, Injurious Falsehood, Nuisance, Trespass to Land, Malicious Prosecution, Unfair Competition, Deceit and Breach of Statutory Duty. • Conduct necessary research and analyze case law relevant to the aforementioned torts. • Apply relevant legislation regarding to the aforementioned torts. • Formulate legal reasoning in resolving legal issues.
