Course purpose and objectives	<p>The purpose of the course is the study and understanding of the specific part of the law of obligations. Therefore, the goal is to provide a detailed presentation of the more specific forms of obligations and legal acts. To this end, an analysis of the part of the Greek Civil Code that concerns the specific law of obligations will be conducted.</p> <p>In parallel, during the study of the provisions of the specific law of obligations, the goal is for students to apply the principles of the general law of obligations to specific obligations relationships, legal transactions, and torts.</p> <p>Additionally, the course aims to develop the students' ability to distinguish the basic characteristics of various types of obligations and legal acts, such as sales contracts, donations and property leases.</p> <p>Finally, the goal is for students to acquire the ability to apply the relevant provisions of the Civil Code in combination, as well as the ability to solve practical problems arising from various obligations relationships.</p>
