<b>Course purpose and objectives</b>	<p>The subject matter of Administrative Procedure Law is the legal framework for the provision of legal protection by administrative courts to individuals against public administration and government organizations. The aim of the course is for students to understand the procedural scope of administrative disputes through the understanding of remedies provided. In addition, the teaching of administrative procedure on the basis in Greek law aims to the understanding of the principles governing administrative proceedings, the structure and organization of administrative courts and teach to students how to apply the appropriate legal measure on each dispute. Finally, the above legal framework for the procedural treatment of administrative disputes, will be understood through the resolution of practical cases.</p>				
<b>Learning outcomes</b>	<p>Upon successful completion of the course, students are expected to have acquired specialized knowledge on the organization and operation of Administrative Justice under Greek law. They will be able to recognize all legal remedies that may be used to protect individuals whose rights have been affected by acts or omissions of the administration, the requirements of admissibility and the grounds for their validity in court, the compliance of the administration with the decisions of the administrative courts and the enforcement of court decisions against the State. With the acquired knowledge, students thus learn what is the appropriate legal remedy to bring at any given time, before which administrative court, within what deadline and against which act or omission of the administration. Finally, students will be able to distinguish the administrative dispute from the private one.</p>
