At the same time, this programme meets the high requirements of the relevant bodies, in Cyprus and Greece as well as abroad, which are responsible for the granting and recognition of professional rights to law graduates.

Admissions Requirements

The minimum admission requirement for the law program is possession of a recognized secondary education diploma: a high school diploma with a minimum grade of **16/20 (for public schools) or 80/100 (for private schools)**, or three **GCE A-Level** exams with grades of **ABB**, or an International Baccalaureate (**IB**) diploma with a score of at least **32**.

Program Requirements

Assessment

Various methods are used to assess students in the programme. A final examination is provided in combination with other methods of continuous assessment such as a midterm examination, in-class presentations, assignments, presentations, etc.

Graduation

For the completion of the programme, students must accumulate 240 ECTS and meet all programme requirements.

Programme Structure

Compulsory Courses (ECTS 192). Depending on which legal system the student chooses to focus on, Cypriot law or Greek law, they must select the courses marked in parentheses with (CY) for Cypriot law and the courses marked in parentheses with (GR) for Greek law.

It is understood that courses marked in parentheses with (CY/GR) are offered for both legal systems.

Elective Courses (ECTS 48).

The student must accumulate 54 ECTS from the elective courses.

Program Learning Outcomes

After completing the programme, students are expected to:

- demonstrate advanced knowledge and critical understanding of the basic theories, principles and concepts of legal science.
- the ability to analyse and evaluate legal rules and the sources of law in general and their impact on social life.
- apply quantitative and qualitative research methods to collect, analyse and interpret data for informed decision making and coherent legal thinking and argumentation.
- develop critical and analytical thinking on legal issues, such as on processes for the production of legal rules as well as on judicial decisions. develop critical and analytical thinking on legal issues, such as on processes for the production of legal rules as well as on judicial decisions.
- understand the Cypriot and Greek legal systems, analyse and identify their common and different characteristics.
- acquire knowledge of specific areas of law and the ability to specialise further in these areas.
- develop skills in legal reasoning and techniques for applying legal rules to factual and practical situations.
- acquire the ability to develop legal reasoning and legal drafting skills.
- develop effective communication, coordination and negotiation skills in a complex and competitive environment.
- develop skills for independent work, including initiative taking, self-organisation and effective time management as well as simultaneous teamwork.
- acquire skills for further academic deepening, such as postgraduate studies.
