Grounded in current scientific theory and research, this programme offers a comprehensive curriculum that emphasises both conceptual knowledge and practical application in diverse psychological domains. The distance learning format is designed to support active engagement, critical thinking, and independent inquiry, while developing the core competencies needed for ethical and professional practice, further academic study, and meaningful contribution to society.

The program is nationally accredited by **CYQAA** and recognized by **KYSATS**.

Admission Requirements

Prospective students need to provide the following:

- High school leaving certificate with a minimum grade of 16/20 (for public schools) or 80 (for private schools) or three GCE A Level exams with grades ABB or International baccalaureate with a minimum of 32 points.
- Native speaker of English or graduate of a high school or university where the language of instruction is English, or IELTS with a score of at least 6.5 or IGCSE with a score of at least C, or TOEFL with a score of at least 250 (computerized) or 550 (conventional), or Password-Plus 5.5.
- Satisfactory personal statement on application.
